Mission

Campus Europae was devised with a clear political objective: to foster unity in diversity and instil an awareness of European citizenship onto a new generation of highly trained and polyglot academics.

Campus Europae was designed in 1998 after the first 10-years-ERASMUS evaluation had been published.

Campus Europae builds on existing ERASMUS infrastructures but adds additional features. For this reason Campus Europae had been called "ERASMUS+", inter alia by former EU Commissioner Jan Figel.



Participation

Campus Europae provides the groundwork for policies designed by the EUF, thus serving as a laboratory for the intense and demanding inter-university cooperation.

Campus Europae is based on the active participation of its member universities. In the last year alone more than 140 members of academic staff and 50 member of technical staff have been engaged in joint meetings and projects across the network in order to continuously develop the network.

Students influence the decision-making process by active and critical counselling. Local Student Bodies autonomously and cooperatively implement Campus Europae policies.



The European University Foundation provides the institutional umbrella for Campus Europae. It is a open network of 18 excellent universities



Campus Europae started exchanging students through its first pilot projects in 2004. Until today more than 500 exchange students have already participated in the programme.

Funding

The first project design from 1998-2003 was financed by German foundations.

Since 2004 the project is funded by the Luxembourg government with € 500.000 per year (mostly used for travelling expenses/meetings).

The European University Foundation has the legal status of a foundation under Luxembourg law.

EUF-CE is represented by its President and Vice-President. The administration is steered by the Secretary General who heads a three-person office. The academic quality is safeguarded by the work of seven Subject Committees.
